We, Christians, are people of promise. It means that we trust the One who made the promise. He has strong credentials: the history testifies his ability to keep his promise. This One is God.

We need to remember: It was God who made the promise to Abram. At that time Abram was a wondering shepherd, rich but vulnerable, travelling across the lands not his, stranger in a foreign country, in high risk of being attacked and killed. To him God made a promise of land and a promise of descendants. These promises have a very strong existential meaning: even though you are a stranger in a foreign country, I will give you enough safe space to live and grow and your life will have a great future: your descendents will be as numerous as the stars in the sky. Abram, even though his faith was tested many times, indeed became not only a father of two great nations and religions: Israelites and Arabs, but also a spiritual father of all who believe in God.

St. Paul in today's second reading states: "our citizenship is in heaven." This world, for us Christians, is not the permanent home. It is not the final destination, it is only a necessary passage to another world that awaits us in the future.

It is about the necessary passage, exodus, that Jesus, Moses and Elijah are talking about in the Gospel. Luke intentionally uses the Greek word, exodos, to describe Jesus' crucifixion as a liberation event similar to the exodus of Israelites from the slavery of Egypt to the freedom of a new land.

Thus the cross of Jesus Christ is the gate through which we pass from this world to another divine world, from slavery of different attachments to material world to freedom of spiritual existence expressed in ability to do good always and everywhere, from slavery of living **for** myself **against** others or **in spite of** others to freedom of life **for** others and **together** with others, sometimes **against** myself. This passage cannot happen without suffering.

The passage from earthly to heavenly existence hurts, but it is necessary, if you really want to be a man or woman of promise, a carrier of hope, a citizen of heaven in this changing world. The choice is yours: you can "live as enemy of the cross of Christ" — as saint Paul says, choosing earthly pleasures, fame, power, light and pleasant life, or be the man or woman of the cross, choosing suffering rather than sin, self-sacrifice rather than fame, service rather than power, happiness rather than passing pleasure.

Dear Sister, Dear Brother, what is your choice?
