Today's Gospel reading contains a wonderful resurrection scene at the conclusion of the *Gospel of John*. The disciples had returned to fishing, to the job they had before they met Jesus. Like the first time reported by Mark, Matthew and Luke (the Synoptics), when Jesus called them to follow him, they were not very successful until the Lord told them to cast their nets off to the right side of the boat. They didn't recognize the Lord until they saw the results. They caught 153 large fish, the number of nations known to exist back then. They were supposed to preach the Gospel to all the nations and bring them to the one Church. Jesus is resurrecting the Church dispersed after the crucifixion!

When Peter and the other disciples in the boat came to Jesus, they found Him sitting at a fire. He offered them breakfast. He ate with them. Jesus was not a ghost. Jesus had a resurrected body. It was holy, but a real human body. He told them to join Him in the meal.

Then we come to that wonderful dialogue between Jesus and Peter demanding the triple affirmation from Peter as a negation of his triple denial on Good Friday. "Do you love me, Simon Peter?" "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." "Then feed my sheep."

Jesus was not about to let Peter wallow in his own guilt and self-pity. Peter had done a terrible thing. He had denied the Lord but he sought the Lord's forgiveness. The gospels say that he wept bitterly after he heard the cock crow. Now, after the Resurrection, Peter would remain the head of the apostles. The only qualification required of him was to love. There is a play on words in original Greek. Jesus asks Peter using the word *agapo* – do you love me as God loves, ready to give your life for me? Peter answers with *fileo* – I love you as a friend, with my human love. In the last question – Jesus uses the verb fileo used by Peter. Thus Jesus calls Peter to grow in his love, but for this moment, to start with it is enough for him Peter's human, imperfect love. Jesus also indicates Peter the way to grow in his love for God - He asks him to feed the Lord's sheep. The rest of Peter's life would be spent feeding the Lord's sheep. And he will grow in his love to reach the level of *agape* – the sacrificial love.

The forgiven and transformed Peter would eventually go to Rome and, as the Roman historian Tertullian states, endure a passion like his Lord's. The Christian theologian, Origen, as well as others wrote that Peter was crucified, head downward. This happened in the Ager Vaticanus, the area on the west bank of the Tiber where Nero had constructed an arena. Christians would eventually build a Church over the burial spot, and then a basilica, the Basilica of St. Peter. The truth of Jesus would continue to nourish the people from Peter and those who stood in his place, the popes. George Weigel mentions in *Letters to Young Catholics* that the large obelisk in the center of the Piazza San Pietro was brought to Rome from Egypt by the Emperor Nero and was placed in the arena where Peter was martyred. It was most likely one of the last things that Peter saw before he died.

Like Peter we must feed others with God's Word. Others are depending on us. A whole world is looking to us. We have a mission to complete with our lives. We are members of the Body of Christ. We need to fulfill our function within the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church, for the good of the world. We must proclaim Jesus Christ with our lives. *Fr. Janusz Roginski, S.A.C.*
